


Number Day—Friday 2nd February

OLI: To understand the causes of the Great Fire of London

Success criteria:

- I know when and how the Great Fire of London started
- I know who Thomas Farriner was
- I know why the fire started or why it spread quickly
- I know the fire started in Pudding Lane, London
- To know what London looked like before and after the fire



Today we learnt about wattle and daub during our alfresco learning workshop on the school field. We learnt how houses were built in the past. We also created our own houses out of different materials to see which house would keep Thomas Farriner the driest. We enjoyed being outside for our learning. We learned that there was not just one cause for the fire in London spreading quickly that it was a mixture of issues that lead to over half of London being destroyed, we worked in groups to decide which factors we thought were the main reasons. We learnt more about the styles of houses during this time in history and made paper versions of these for our walls. We then went on to work out how London has changed since the Great fire by sorting images into past and present.

Unlocking Autism for Parents

**Assisting parental understanding of autism,
communication and sensory needs.**

Who is it for?

- **Unlocking Autism is a free course for parents and carers of children and young people with communication and interaction needs. You must live in North Yorkshire or your child attend a North Yorkshire school or setting to be eligible. Children do not need to have a diagnosis of autism in order for parents to attend.**

What will I learn?

- **The programme includes sessions on behaviour, emotional regulation, Communication, sensory differences and autism providing practical tools and strategies to support children and young people.**

When does the course take place?

- **This is an online course which consists of five sessions which either run over two full days or as five, 2 hour webinars. It is recommended that parents/carers complete all five sessions in order to derive maximum benefit from the programme.**

How do I book?

Have your say about the refurbishment of Mint Garth Play Area in Knaresborough

North Yorkshire Council is working with Knaresborough Town Council on a project to improve the quality of the Mint Garth Play Area in Knaresborough. The play area currently lacks a good range of play equipment for a wide age range of users. There is a lot of unused space on the play area site which we feel would benefit from some up-to-date play equipment.

This public consultation will gather opinions from residents to help create the most suitable design for the play area. The consultation report will be used to create a wish list for the design brief, which will influence the final decision.

The money (£50,000) for this project would come from the S106 money (Commuted Sums). This is money paid to North Yorkshire Council by property developers when providing residential properties within the council area.
